Infection control has always been a top priority for our practice and you may have seen this during your visits to our office. Our infection control processes are made so that when you receive care, it's both safe and comfortable. We want to tell you about the infection control procedures we follow in our practice to keep patients and staff safe.

Our office follows infection control recommendations made by the American Dental Association (ADA), the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). We follow the activities of these agencies so that we are up-to-date on any new rulings or guidance that may be issued. We do this to make sure that our infection control procedures are current and adhere to each agencies' recommendations.

You may see some changes when it is time for your next appointment. We made these changes to help protect our patients and staff. For example:

- Our office will communicate with you beforehand to ask some universal screening questions
- We have hand sanitizer that we will ask you to use when you enter the office
- We will minimize your time in the waiting room.
- Appointments will be managed to allow for social distancing between patients. That might mean that you're offered fewer options for scheduling your appointment.
- We will ask you to wear a personal mask entering our office
- We will take your temperature and verify it is below 100.4 degrees F
- We will also have you rinse with 1.5% hydrogen peroxide
- We will minimize aerosols in our office so some procedures will be different then you are accustomed to
- We ask you complete health questionnaires and office documents at home using our webpage
